

# Sierra via Summon: SAML for Saved Searches

## Ability to log into Saved Searches using SAML authentication

### Details

- Adds SAML integration to Saved Searches for Sierra via Summon institutions
- Allows for storage of Saved Searches on Summon Servers
- GDPR Compliant
- In addition to MS OneDrive and Google Drive logins

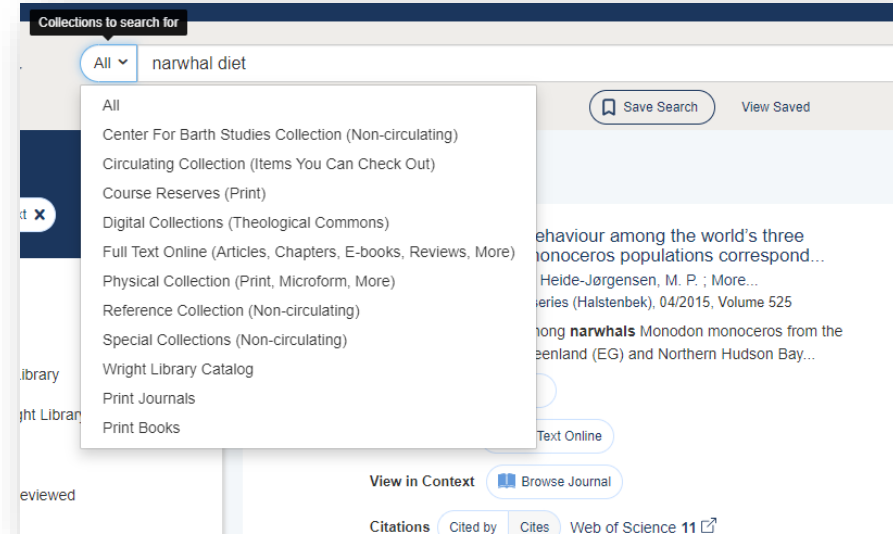


# Scopes for Summon Searches

**Allow users to 'pre-filter' their search, limiting to a specific group vs. searching the full catalog**

## Details

- Create scopes, and prioritize display order when there are multiple scopes
- Limit to local records
- Limit by Content Type, Discipline, Language, New Records, and Time Period
- Add or remove resources by ISBN/ISSN to a search scope
- Add library locations to a search scope



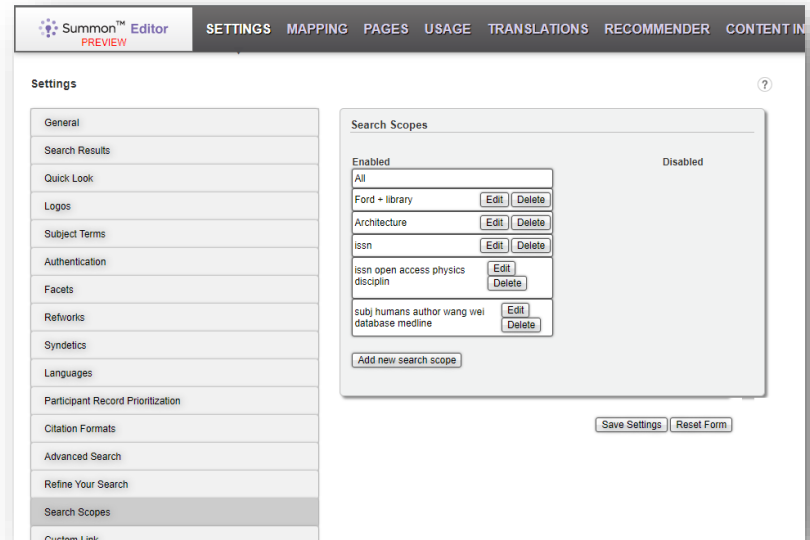


# Scopes for Summon Searches

## How to Configure Search Scopes for Summon

### Details

- Controls for Search Scopes is found in the Admin Console under Settings > Search Scopes
- Existing Scopes will appear at the top and can be enabled, disabled, edited, or deleted




# Scopes for Summon Searches

## How to Configure Search Scopes for Summon

### Details

- To create a new Scope, click on the Add New Search Scope button at the bottom
- A form similar to the advanced search form will appear
- Fill out the Name (which will display in the Scope Dropdown on the search library page) and Description (for your internal use)
- Complete the form and save to create a new scope

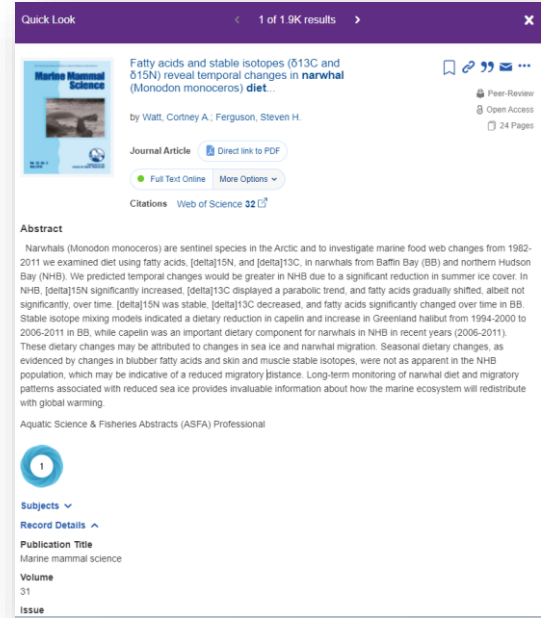


# Improve the Quick Look Pane Layout

## A more flexible layout to accommodate various metadata

### Details

- Usefulness of Quick Look pane varies based on the amount and type of metadata available for display
- Adjust the layout so the Quick Look displays all information well regardless of what information is absent or present




# “Include Matches in Full Text” to Search Suggestions

## Improve the user experience on the Zero Results Page

### Details

- Add the ability to apply the “Include Matches in Full Text” facet via a link on the Zero Results Page
- Option will appear automatically if Include Matches in Full Text is set to on and the search does not already include Full Text facet

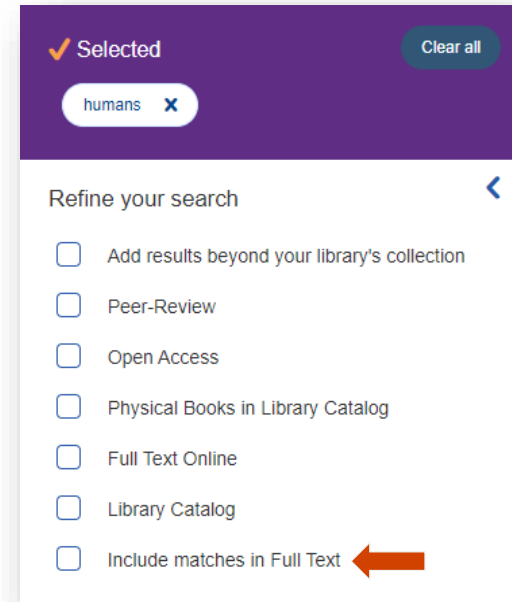

- Allow institutions to determine order of display for Database Finder, custom panels, and Topic Explorer

# Normalized Subject Headings: A CDI Update

## How to Turn on Normalized CDI Subjects

### Details

- To configure the use of Normalized Subject Headings for your facets, you'll find the controls in the Admin Console, under Settings > Subject Terms:
- For the control Use Normalized CDI Subjects, switch from Default to Custom and set the field to ON
- Click the Save Settings button and within 5 minutes the update should be applied to your instance of Summon

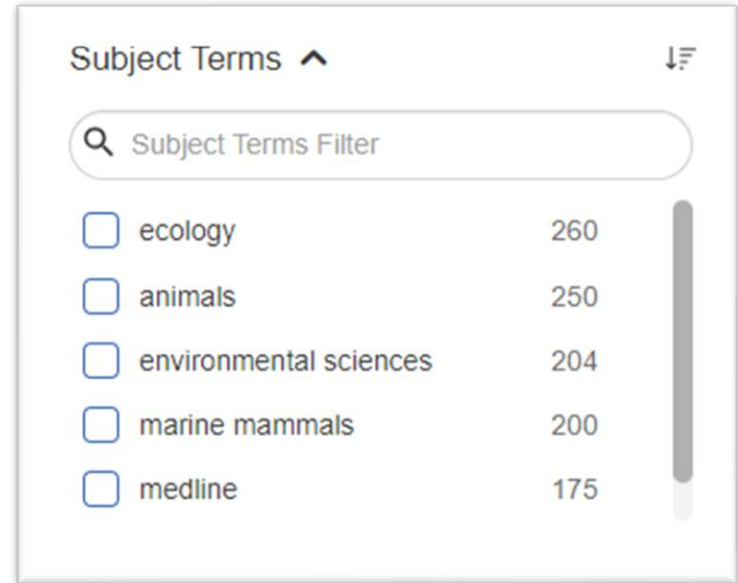


# Normalized Subject Headings: A CDI Update

- The Normalized Subject Headings will replace your current Subject Terms facet
- Subject headings that could not be mapped, including all non-English subjects, are still available for display and search when the new normalized subject headings are in use
- Institutions can choose between maintaining Subject Headings as they are today or replacing them with Normalized Subject Headings



# Unpaywall Now Available as a Collection

## Changing from Augmenting Records to a Collection Improves Open Access Functionality

### Details

- Unpaywall will now be an option under the Database facet
- Records merged with Unpaywall records will be flagged as having an Open Access (OA) option
- OA labeling and faceting on the search results page will now reflect OA status from Unpaywall



# Unpaywall Now Available as a Collection

## Subscribe to the Collection in Client Center after the Release

### Details

- Indexed Unpaywall links will be returned by CDI as regular IEDL links and will be prioritized using standard linking logic
- Unpaywall links will be returned as the "Link to PDF" element on the Summon search result when there is no available Quick Link
- Adding Unpaywall to your instance of Summon will follow the same process as adding any other collection to Summon

## CDI Rights Processing

- Reduce to 24 – 30 hours average



## Data quality

- Improve consistency of language and publication date fields

## Bigger, longer term data projects

- Addition of secondary resource types for CDI





# Addition of Secondary Resource Types for CDI

**CDI secondary content types provide specific information about the type of record**





## Details


- They do not replace but add value to the record's primary content types
- Their purpose is:
  - To display additional information about the record/item in the brief display and Quick Look
  - To allow filter/search on these secondary types as part of Secondary Content Type facet





- **Warning** – These types display above the brief display of a record in the search results and Quick Look
