

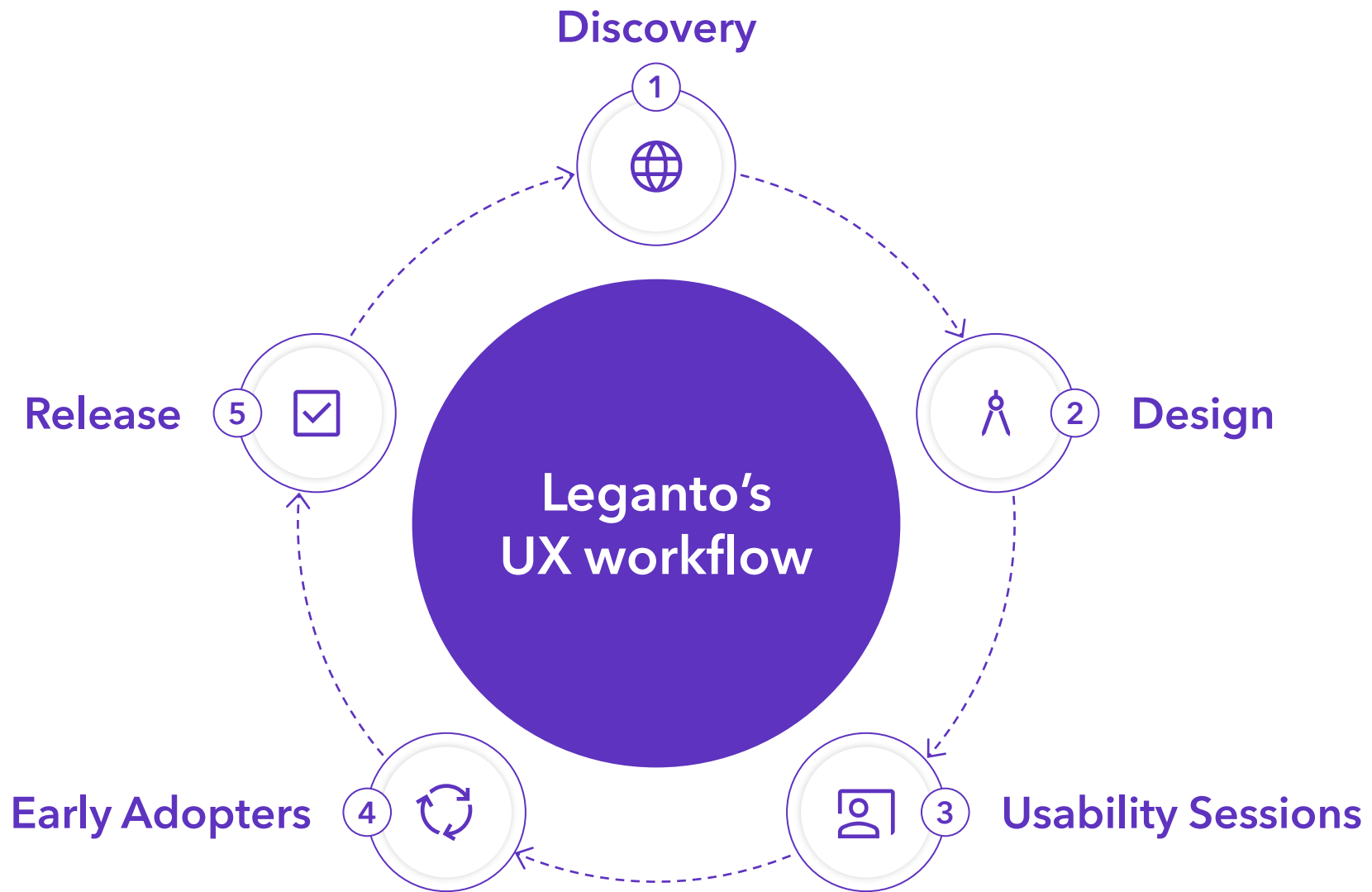

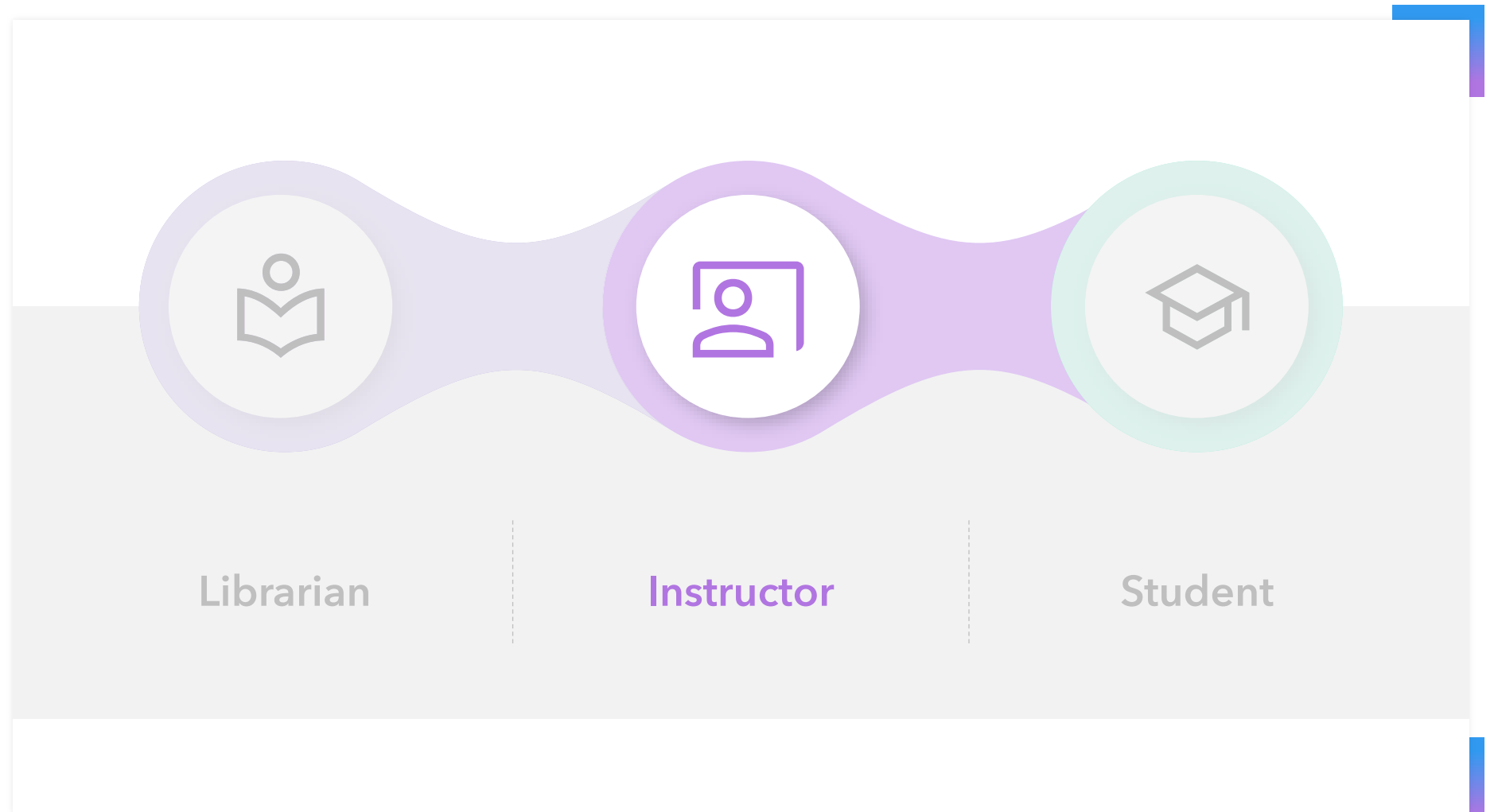

How can we improve Leganto?

Vertically align the "view online" button in citations

Hello. We are migrating from Talis to Leganto.

In Talis, our students can find the same place as they search (Students primarily access chapters) rather than finding

In Leganto however, the "view online" button means that as the user scrolls to the side, offering a poor UX (attached image)

It would be advantageous to have the button upfront in the citation information

HTML in list notes and list and sections' description fields

In some cases, an instructor needs to provide extra information to their student by referring to an external website.

Use case: "All the citations in this section cannot be booked through the library but can be found in the compendium. More information <a>here."

It would be very useful to use HTML in the list notes, or in the description field of the list or sections. Both so instructors can use links, but also to make the information more visible if it comes after a long list of citations (in the case of a list note).

Search scope of library search in Leganto

The Search scope that was selected when I cleared the search term in Library Search by pressing x will return to the initial state. We want the Search scope once selected to be retained.

Hide instructors ability to restrict access to reading lists based on time intervals

In Leganto, instructors have a lot of opportunities to restrict access to the reading list by setting specific time intervals where resources are visible. This includes separate settings for entire reading lists, sections, citations and uploaded material. We have received reports from our libraries that these functions are sometimes used incorrectly by the instructors. The instructors often do not grasp all the consequences of using these features and end up causing these resources to become unavailable at inopportune times and not knowing why. For instance, an instructor might set the reading list to be visible from August 10th – December 20th not realizing that students might want to access the material during the summer break leading up to the course term.

Make it easier to edit templates within Leganto

Once a template has been created it is not possible to edit the template. It also means that other lists using the original template are not updated manually. We would like the option to edit templates and have them saved to all reading lists using that template.

My Collection enhancements

Our instructors are big fans of My Collection but they are missing features that are available for lists:

- 1) Sections or folders. Having tags is nice but in no way the same thing
- 2) Drag & Drop citations to re-order the list. Goes together with 1) - at the moment there is no way to bring structure to My Collection which makes it cluttered and takes the joy out of working with it.
- 3) Separate the menu options into "Suggest item for a list" and "Add item to a list" so that there is a clear distinction between adding something to your own list vs. suggesting it for someone else's list.
- 4) Make the private note visible in the list view of My Collection.
- 5) Print. This is possible for lists but for My Collection you have to export the citations before you can print them.
- 6) Edit item from list view instead of having to open it in full view.
