Content Back to Basics

KB (SFX, Alma, 360)

- Title level metadata
- Electronic Resource Management tool
- Link Resolver
- Includes collections (aka provider offerings)
- We receive from the providers KBART, MARC (format and MD not always standardized)

Index (CDI)

- Article level metadata
- Includes rich records: authors, subjects, abstract, full text, etc. (legal agreements)
- CDI content is optimized for keyword search (Discovery)
- Local catalogs for Summon clients
- We receive from the providers XML, MARC (format and MD not always standardized)



Content in Numbers

Three KBs

- Over **58,000** collections
- Over 70 million holdings


One Index





Discovery Ingestion Best Practices



- 1) Identify new content to add to CDI
- 2) Review and evaluate sample content
- **3)** Approve sample content
- 4) Sign data-sharing agreement
- **5)** Acquire/deliver full content set (by provider)
- 6) Normalize & map data
- 7) Configure Linking and Rights
- 8) Load data
- 9) Maintain & support

Delivery and Discovery Interoperability















CDI Rights



Rights are calculated per institution, per record, based on KB activations

Title-Level Rights:

Based on identifier match between the KB activations and the CDI records

Collection-Level Rights:

Based on collection identifier (DBID), in the KB and in the CDI records



Fully Flexible

Summon and Easy Active

"Active for Search"

Not active for search

Expand Search =
Keyword match + Not Available

First Search = Keyword match + Available

Expand Search = Keyword match + Not Available Restricted for search First Search = Keyword match + Available

Results are from all metadata sources, including alternative coverage

Best Practices for Rights

- Full text activation is also Search activation
- "We subscribe to only some titles in this collection" Y/N
 - Link in Record collections with portfolios: No (collection level rights)
 - Link Resolver collections: Yes (title level rights)
- "CDI-only full text activation" available in Link in Record and A&I collections
 - Collection level rights
 - Use to activate for FT in CDI and not publish to Discovery the collection's Bib/portfolios
- A&I collections
 - Activate like a FT collection
 - Records will show as FT when matched to other FT collections.
- Search Rights Free/Subscription
 - "Subscription" when provider requires a subscription to view the records



Best Practices for Linking

- OpenURL linking (Link Resolver)
 - For Selective, Aggregator and A&I collections
 - We use platform-specific document ID where available

Link In Record

 Where OpenURL is not possible, or record is unique and available from only one platform

Primo LinkTemplate

- Where the provider requires authentication with specific parameters in the link
- Read more: Supported Linking Methods



A&I and Hybrid A&I Collections

A&I collections offer metadata and not Full Text

- Records will appear as "Full Text Available" if they match to other activations
 - For example Web of Science record will have link to ProQuest

- Hybrid A&I collections
 - Part of the records have direct links to FT
 - We plan to maintain one collection where possible, and have the records with FT appear as available with direct link, and the A&I record behave like classic A&I
