
Introduction

 Developers Network blog <u>How to make license information appear in Primo View It (View Online) after clicking Available Online</u>
- If an electronic collection or an electronic portfolio has a <u>license</u>, then it is possible to display a link to show the license information (license terms) from within the Primo View It tab.
- In this presentation we will show it is possible for the institution to make the license information appear to the end user in the Primo ViewIt.
- Note that the license is displayed to the end user but does not have a functional effect. It is for informational purposes only.






• We have license named "A. Chen Publishing"






- The electronic collection "iG Publishing: Pearson Education Taiwan" uses the license "A. Chen Publishing"
- This electronic collection is active and has 98 portfolios.
- On the next slide we see the "General" tab of the "Electronic Collection Editor", and we can see that license "A. Chen Publishing" is attributed to this electronic collection







 One of the portfolios in the electronic collection "iG Publishing: Pearson Education Taiwan" is "There's no business that's not show business: marketing in an experience culture"





• There is no way to view the license information






 Go to "Configuration > Fulfillment > Discovery Interface Display Logic > Other Settings".

Check the box "Enable Display of License Information" and save










An example after configuring the display of License Information


 Again, we will perform a search in Primo for electronic resource "There's no business that's not show business: marketing in an experience culture" and click "Available Online"





An example after configuring the display of License Information


• Now we **do** see a link to the license information. We have a "Show License" link.





An example after configuring the display of License Information

• After clicking "Show License" the link changes to "Hide License" and we see selected "License Terms".








- It is possible to configure which license terms will display in the View It tab.
- To configure which license terms will display in the View It tab:
 - Navigate to "Configuration > Acquisitions > Licenses > Manage License Terms"
 - In the "Display to public" tab select "Yes" or "No"
- See also: <u>Adding a License Term</u>.




 Navigate to "Configuration > Acquisitions > Licenses > Manage License Terms"






• In the "Display to public" tab select "Yes" or "No"






 Term "Archiving Right" is defined as "No" and therefore does not display to the end user in Primo






• Now we have changed "Archiving right" to Display to public by selecting "Yes" in the "Display to Public" tab.






 Again, we will perform a search in Primo for electronic resource "There's no business that's not show business: marketing in an experience culture" and click "Available Online"






• Again, we will click "Show License"





Now we do see the term "Archiving right"
