## **Overview**

- The Amazon Search feature allows the staff user to search in Amazon via the Alma User Interface.
- In this way a bibliographic record, item and order can quickly and easily be created using the data retrieved from Amazon as well as POL templates.
- This significantly streamlines the ordering process.
- 1. There is no need to leave the Alma interface in order to perform the search in Amazon.
- The order and corresponding bibliographic record are created in Alma using the title and identifier from Amazon

 From the Alma Main menu, click the 'Item Search in Amazon' entry under Acquisitions > Advanced Tools.



This option appears if staff user has at least one of the following roles:


- 1. Purchasing Manager





# Results appear and each record displays the Title, ISBN, List Price and Language




Click 'View in Amazon' to view the item in the Amazon web site




 After clicking 'View in Amazon' a new tab will open in the browser with the specific record retrieved in Amazon.



# Click 'Item Lookup' to view additional information



- After clicking 'Item Lookup' we can see not only the Title, ISBN, List Price and Language
- We also see the Lowest New Price, Lowest Used Price, Total New and Total Used.



This information did not appear in the initial results list

- Clicking 'Create Order' will create the corresponding bibliographic record, item and order.
- Typically the order will be created with a corresponding POL template which has the same Amazon vendor used when performing the Item Search (for example 'Amazon-USA' or 'Amazon-Germany').
- This order is created in Alma, not in Amazon. The assumption is that the staff user will also create the order in the Amazon website.




# Future developments – Import record

- From the search results it will be possible not only to "create order" but also to import the bibliographic record.
- A new "Import" link will be added to the search results
- Clicking this link will import the bibliographic record without an order.
- This will be similar to what is done today when importing from an external search resource.

# Future developments – Arrive to Import Lookup

- When the search results in only one result it will immediately go to the "item lookup" page.
- Today when there is one result the user first arrives to the "Item Search in Amazon" results page and then must click "Item" lookup to get to the item lookup page

# Future developments – Arrive to Import Lookup

 With new development when user searches for unique record (such as title "E-metrics for Library and Information Professionals") ...

# Future developments – sticky defaults of previous search


 Then next time he accesses "Item search in Amazon" the system will default automatically to Amazon Location "Germany" and Sort list by "Publication Date"

# Future developments – sort by price on results page

- A new sort option will be added on the results page.
- The sort will be by price
- The default will be "low to high" (ascending)
- It will be possible to change it to "high to low" (descending)
