






Problem: Summon Displays Unsubscribed Resources




Hierarchy of Data in the ProQuest Knowledgebase







Summon Index Breadth

Any Summon library will likely have some unique titles *not* currently discoverable in Summon.

New content is always being added. Watch <u>Summon Release</u>
 <u>Notes</u> and the <u>Summon Listserv</u> for content announcements.



2.7 + Billion Citations And GROWING

Catalog Records vs Intota for E-resources? Do both!

- 1. Upload catalog records for your e-books and e-journals:
 - Ensure title-level discovery of your holdings, even if the content is not yet indexed in Summon.
 - Contribute your cataloging efforts such as subject headings to the Summon Index.
- 2. Add e-journal and e-book databases to Intota to:
 - Enable article and chapter-level discovery in Summon.
 - Make e-resources available via 360 Link from all referring sources.
 - Allow e-resources to be discovered in your E-Journal Portal.

Data Optimization Checklist

• Use the <u>Data Optimization Checklist</u> to ensure that Intota will provide the best possible user experience with your Discovery tools:

CRITICAL: Add Your Subscription Databases

Add your full-text eJournal and eBook databases:



- Add your "zero-title" databases for Summon:
 - Abstracting and indexing (A & I)
 - HathiTrust
 - Special content types (videos, audio, images, etc.)
 - ProQuest Dissertations (can be made to work with 360 Link too)





Your library's catalog, study guides and repositories will appear as 0-title databases.

CRITICAL: Remove Cancelled Databases from Discovery



CRITICAL: Choose Correct Regional and Consortium Databases

- Choose databases designed for your region if available:
- Examples:
 - African Writers Series International Clien African Writers Series





HathiTrust (Global Public Domain only)
 HathiTrust (Public Domain within US only)





- Choose databases designed for your consortium
- Do not choose databases meant for other consortia
- Examples:
 - Oxford Journals SCELC
 - Emerald SURFmarket
 - Elsevier ICM




CRITICAL: Verify Title Selection

Whenever possible, select the whole database:



• When appropriate, select individual titles:




- Use the right tool for the job:
 - Hand-pick titles if you have just a few.
 - Upload your title list using the <u>Offline Date and Status</u> <u>Editor (ODSE)</u>.



Use Excel's VLOOKUP function to match your vendor's title list for a database to Intota's title list for a database to simplify upload.


CRITICAL: Verify Title Selection (continued)

 If your Title Coverage option is "ONLY SELECTED titles", but you really subscribe to the whole database...



CRITICAL: Verify Title Selection(some additional tips)

- Sign up for <u>Automated Holdings Management</u> if you have a direct purchase or PDA/DDA triggered purchase program with:
 - **EBL**: Ebook Library (AZZ)
 - ebrary: ebrary Perpetual Access, PDA, and STL (JJU)
 - ProQuest Ebooks: Ebook Central Perpetual and DDA (AABBV)



 Avoid the Single Journals database from the "Provider" called Multiple Vendors when selecting individual titles. Choose real provider databases to improve linking reliability.



CRITICAL: Customize Coverage Dates

• Customize coverage dates only if your library subscribes to a date range other than the default.




- Use <u>valid date formats</u> when entering dates:
 - Fixed dates (such as 01/01/2003)
 - Relative dates (such as 5 years ago)
- Use the right tool for the job:
 - Hand-enter date ranges for just a few journals.
 - Use the <u>Offline Date and Status Editor (ODSE)</u> for many journals needing custom date ranges.
 - Set date range for all journals in database.

RECOMMENDED: Hide Partial-Coverage Databases

- Certain databases contain <u>journals with partial content</u> coverage; some articles are missing.
- These databases have names containing the words "Selected Full Text" in parentheses.
- Avoid broken article links by hiding these databases from Summon and 360
 Link.
- Consider showing these databases in the **E-Journal Portal (360 Core)** and **360 MARC Updates** which link at the journal level.

Which databases tracked by ProQuest are free e-resources?

Update October 28, 2014: Added 1 database to the list of Free Resources: Wayne State University Ramsey Juvenile Literature Collection.

Update October 14, 2014: Added 1 database to the list of Free Resources: Wiley-Blackwell AGU Free Content.

Serials Solutions tracks many databases that contain journals and books that are free for any library to use. Your patrons can access these databases by adding them to your library's profile in the Client Center.

However, we are aware that there are some databases we track that have free journals but problem is we have no way of confirming whether databases have free journals; that inform vendors. We have no automated way to generate and maintain this list.






CRITICAL: Add Institution Identifiers

- Some providers require special settings for authentication.
- Settings vary by database and provider. See the <u>Databases that</u> <u>Require Custom Configurations</u> for details.
- You may need to:
 - Customize your database URLs:

CRITICAL: Do Not Use Database-Level URL for Titles




- This setting is ONLY for libraries that use Dynix RPA for remote authentication
- Contact ProQuest Support if the "Use database-level for all titles" column contains a "Yes" for any of your databases and you do not use Dynix RPA.
- We will turn off the setting and help you fix any URL issues that may have prompted you to select this option in the past.

RECOMMENDED: Omit Proxy When Not Needed

- If you entered a proxy URL in Library Settings, it will automatically apply to all of your resources.
- Turn off the proxy where it is not needed, for example:
 - Your library catalog, study guides, and institutional repositories
 - Open-access databases





CRITICAL: Configure Your Proxy Service

Do you use a proxy server to provide remote access to e-resources?

- Avoid linking errors by keeping your proxy configurations up to date:
 - Make sure your proxy configurations include all of your content providers' domains.
 - Add special domains for Summon and 360 Link resources that support Index Enhanced Direct Linking.
 - See: Resources That Support Index Enhanced Direct Linking.
- Add Summon to your proxy configurations. See: <u>Summon: Web-Based</u>
 <u>Proxy Support</u>



CRITICAL: Configure 360 Link Referring Sources

 Activate 360 Link with content providers for the e-resources in which you want to see links to 360 Link:








