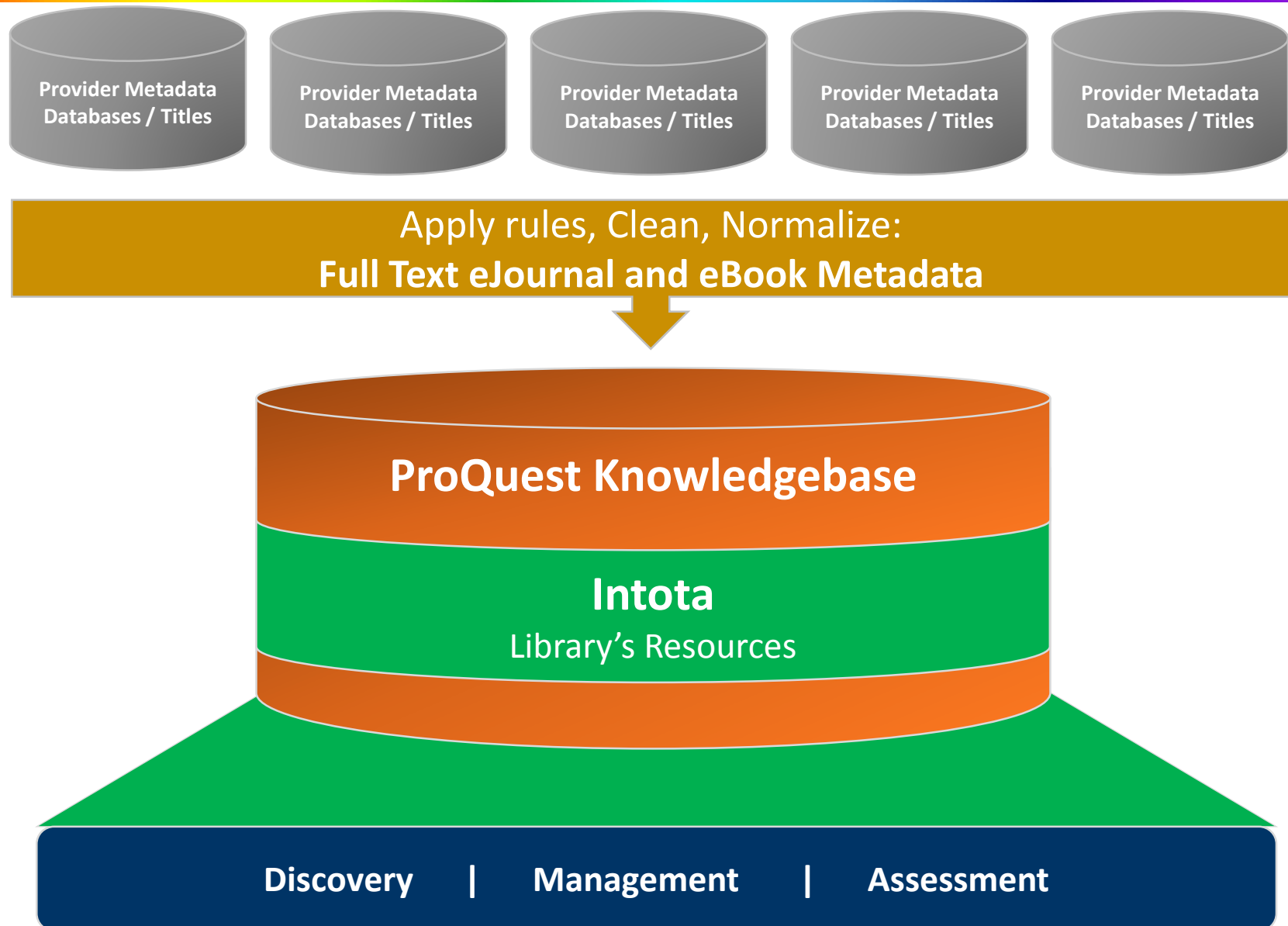

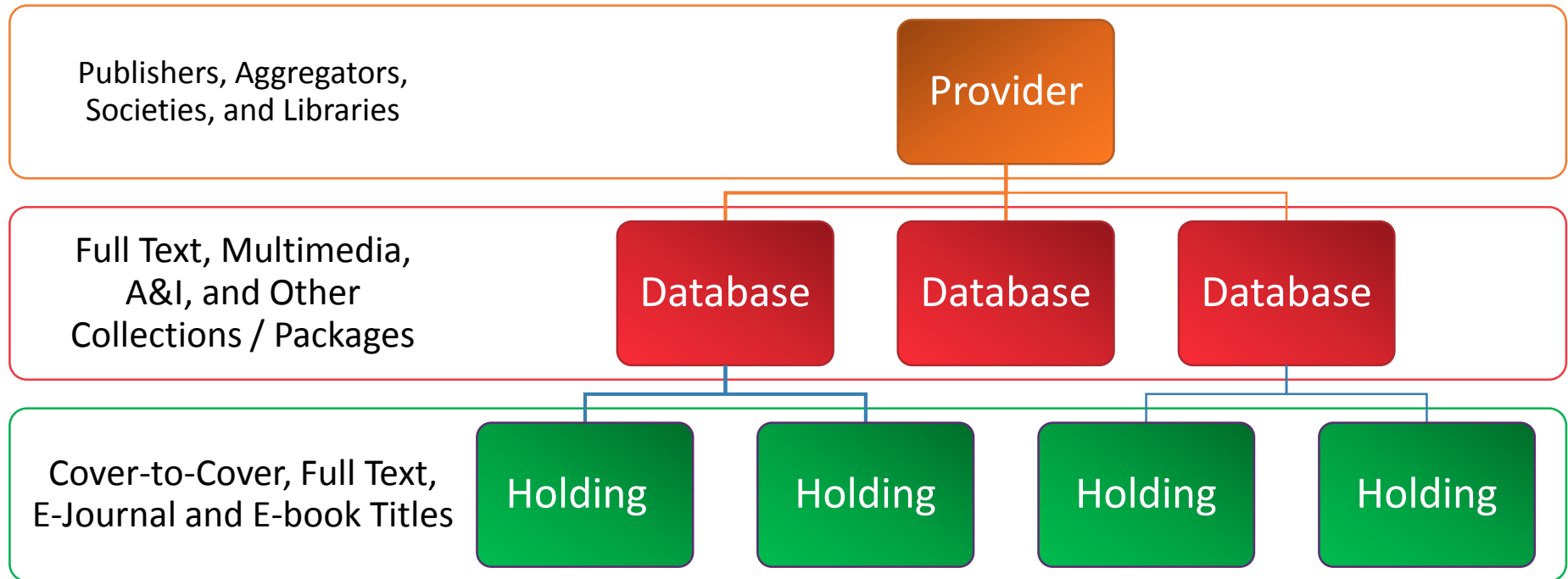

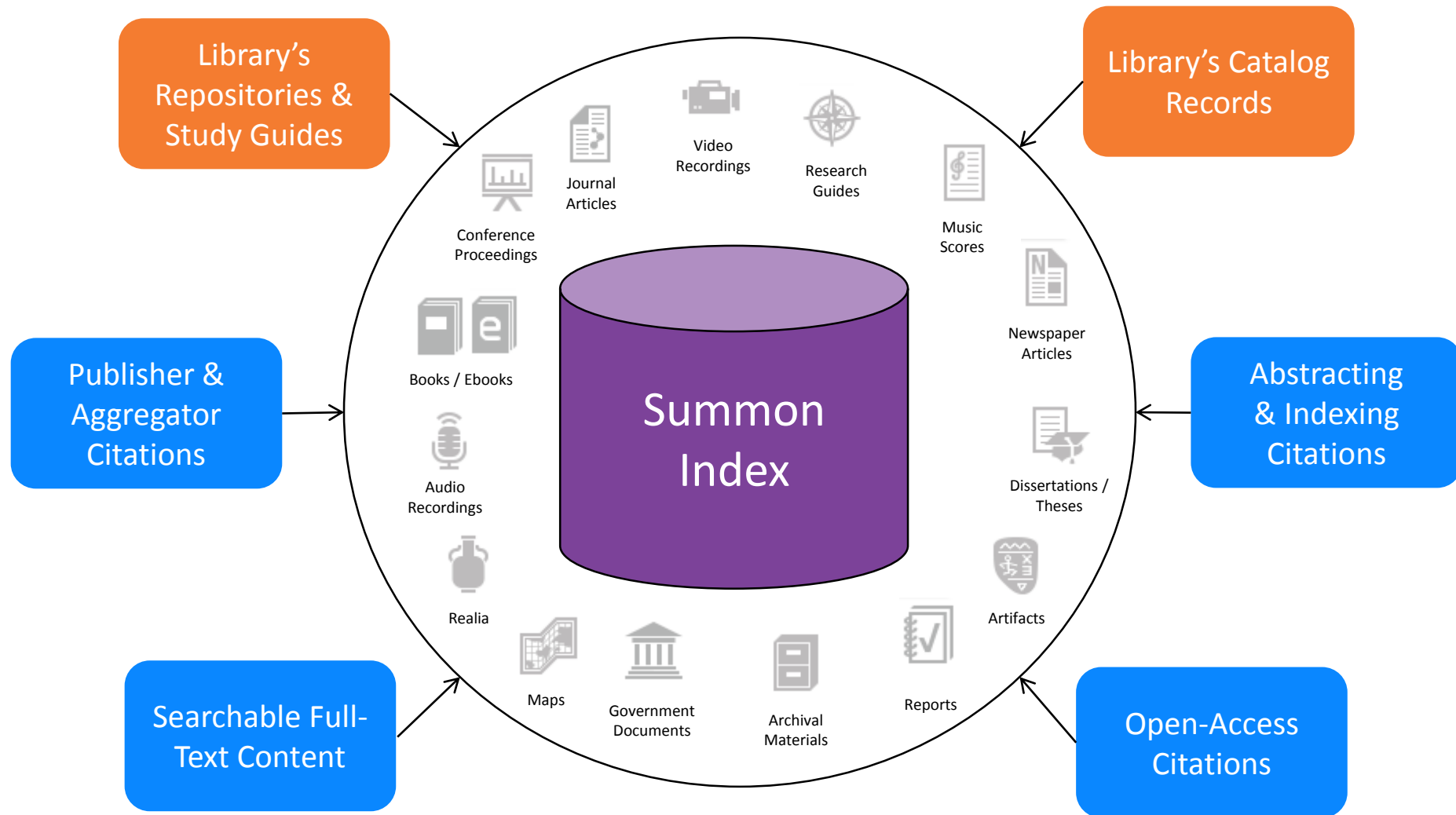
# Hierarchy of Data in the ProQuest Knowledgebase

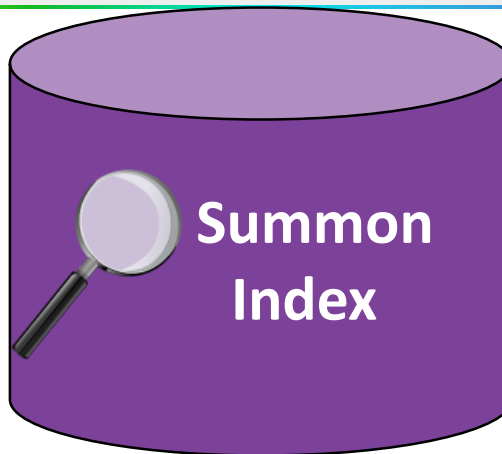

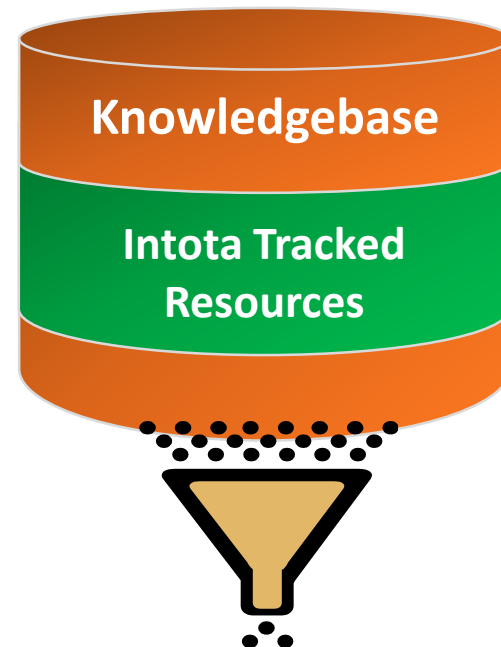

The potential for avian fatalities at proposed wind power developments often generates concern and controversy because of the large number of avian fatalities that have been documented at some older wind power developments (e.g., Altamont Pass, Calif., USA; Orloff and Flannery 1992), the relatively small number of avian fatalities at many modern wind power developments (Erickson et al. 2001), and the uncertainty of predicting the number of avian fatalities at future wind power developments (U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service [USFWS] 2003). Avian fatalities at modern wind power developments, however, are most often associated with nocturnal migration (Dobson et al. 2006). During the daytime (Gauthreaux 1975, Kerlinger 1995) warrant the need for studies to investigate the dynamics of nocturnal bird migration at proposed wind power developments (USFWS 2003). Mobile X-band radar systems (Cooper et al. 1991, Harmata et al. 1999) have been used to characterize nocturnal bird migration in the Pacific Northwest (Mabee and Cooper 2004), Montana (Harmata et al. 1999), New York (Cooper et al. 1995), and New Hampshire (Williams et al. 2001). This technology is well suited for studying low-altitude migration (<1.5 km above ground level [agl]) at wind power development sites and is uniquely able to provide local information about bird flight altitudes, flight direction, behavior, and passage rates (number of targets per kilometer per hour) at a moderate spatial scale (approx. 1.5-km radius around the sampling location). An understanding of the vertical distribution of migratory birds is especially useful because it allows an assessment of passage rates specifically within the heights of modern wind turbines (<125 m agl) and above them.

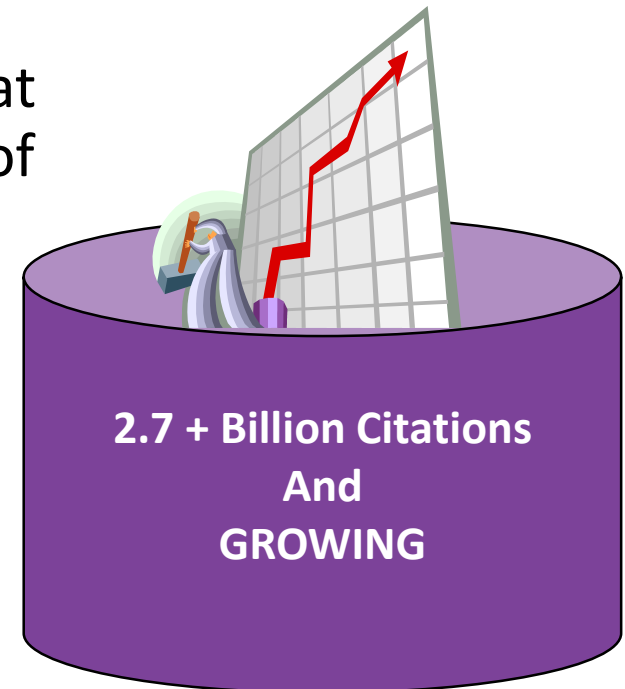



- New content is always being added. Watch [Summon Release Notes](#) and the [Summon Listserv](#) for content announcements.
- See the [Summon: Provider Content in the Summon Index](#) article for:
  - Publisher, package, and title lists that give the overall sense of the scope of the Summon Index.
  - Instructions on how to confirm if specific content is covered in the Summon Index.



# Catalog Records vs Intota for E-resources? Do both!

1. Upload catalog records for your e-books and e-journals:
  - Ensure title-level discovery of your holdings, even if the content is not yet indexed in Summon.
  - Contribute your cataloging efforts – such as subject headings – to the Summon Index.
2. Add e-journal and e-book databases to Intota to:
  - Enable article and chapter-level discovery in Summon.
  - Make e-resources available via 360 Link from all referring sources.
  - Allow e-resources to be discovered in your E-Journal Portal.

# Revisit the Data Optimization Checklist

- Maintaining your Intota settings = providing positive research experiences to users.
- Revisit the [Data Optimization Checklist](#) periodically.

## 1. [Review Database and Title Selections](#)

✓	Priority	Steps to Take
	Critical	Review your subscribed databases in Intota, and add any missing resources.
	Critical	Remove cancelled databases from Discovery Services.
	Critical	Choose regional and consortium databases only if they are appropriate for your library.
	Critical	Verify your title selections: Select individual titles only if your subscription does not cover the whole database.
	Critical	Customize coverage dates for titles if your library subscribes to a database with a date range other than the default date range.
	Recommended	Hide databases containing selected (incomplete) full-text from Summon 360 Link.
	Optional	Add open-access resources to Intota.
	Optional	Create Custom Databases for non-electronic holdings such as print and microform.



## 2. [Refine Database Settings](#) (HINT: Use the Database Details Report)

✓	Priority	Steps to Take
	Critical	Confirm that the desired Discovery Services are turned on for your databases.
	Critical	Add Custom URLs and identifiers to databases from providers that require special settings for authentication.
	Critical	For certain clients: Ask the client to turn off the "Library level" for all titles.
